

The Tango Project Survey

We want to prevent the difficulties (including abuse and discrimination) lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans and intersex (LGBTI) elders aged 65 years or more experience on the basis of their LGBTI identities. To do this we need to understand the difficulties better; so we are asking LGBTI elders (or their advocates) to share their experiences with us by phone or by using this survey.

We launched the Tango Project Survey in October 2016 and will continue the project until October 2018. The project team is led by Dr Catherine Barrett, Director of Alice's Garage and Ro Allen, Gender and Sexuality Commissioner for Victoria, and includes a number of LGBTI Elders. A project advisory group includes a number of Commissioners and Advocacy Groups.

The survey focuses on difficulties (including abuse or discrimination) that occurred between 1st October 2016 and 1st October 2018 in Victoria – that were experienced by LGBTI people aged 65 years or more, on the basis of their LGBTI identity.
